And bring with you:

Sleeping items: sleeping bag, mattress or pad, pillow, tent (campers will camp with their groups).

Personal items (this is not an all inclusive list!): towels, swimsuit, clothes for all weather (hot, cool and everything in-between!), sunscreen, bug spray, hat, toothbrush, etc.

Riding Equipment: **Medical release and armband**, helmet, boots, all gear needed for horse and rider, riders must wear helmet, boots and shirts with sleeves covering point of shoulder.

Stabling: **Bedding!** It is not provided so bring your choice of bedding for the duration of camp. Water and feed buckets, salt, feed, fly spray, all gear needed for comfort and care of horse.
